Mr. Richard Foust inquired as to the status of the 22 Oak Street property maintenance issue and expressed his concerns.

 Motion by McLallen, seconded by Patterson to adopt Resolution No. 11 of 2009, joining the SHACOG for the purchase of a 2009 Police Interceptor. The motion was carried by a majority (4 – 1).

 Council discussed gathering information on roofing options for the municipal building.

Motion by Hart, seconded by Ewing to authorize the Maintenance Supervisor to purchase a leaf blower from Lowe's costing approximately \$200.00. The motion was carried unanimously.

Motion by Hart, seconded by Patterson to have Schutz Directional Drilling Inc. drill the water line to from the existing line under Railroad Street into the Park to hook up the lion drinking fountain costing \$750.00. The motion was carried unanimously.

#### **NEW BUSINESS**

Motion by Hart, seconded by Sweet to adopt Resolution No. 10 of 2009, agreeing to use dotGrants on-line reporting system. The motion was carried unanimously.

Motion by Ewing, seconded by McLallen to waive all zoning fees associated with Helping Hands roof repair. The motion was carried unanimously.
