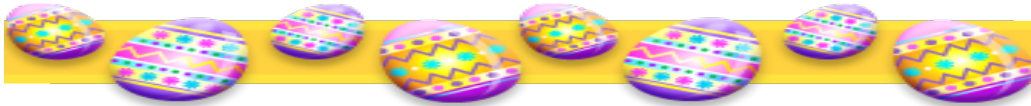
ANNUAL SPRING CLEANUP DAY (FOR BOROUGH RESIDENTS ONLY)

RESTRICTIONS:

- * No dirt, sod, stones or ashes
- * No food waste (since residents should have weekly disposal service)
- * No appliances with Freon. Only appliances that the Freon has been removed and tagged will be picked up.

Everyone should be receiving the 2010 Census Questionnaires in the mail very soon. Please complete and return your questionnaire to the Census Bureau as soon as possible. The success of the 2010 Census count is vitally important to the future of the Borough of Stoneboro. Not only does our community's political representation in the U. S. House of Representatives and in the State Legislature rest on census population totals, but funding we receive from the state and federal government is dependant on census statistics. We're talking about money to help maintain or repair our roads and funding to update school textbooks, as well as funds for other programs. If everyone is not counted, it means our community will be shortchanged and we will not receive our fair share of these funds.

The local earned income taxes are due by April 15th. Anyone that has not filed correctly by that date will be considered delinquent and will begin accruing penalty & interest at the rate of 1% per month.
